

TERRITORIAL PARK PATROL OFFICER II**CHARACTER OF DUTIES:**

This is complex parks and off-shore patrol work involving the enforcement of laws under the Territorial Park System. Employees in this class perform the full range of enforcement duties and may lead the work of less experienced Park Patrol Officers.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: (These examples do not list all the duties which may be assigned; any one position may not include all the duties listed).

Patrols units of the Guam Territorial Park System on foot, vehicle or boat to ensure compliance with laws, codes and ordinances relating to the protection of visitors, off-shore, and park resources through the island.

Enforces laws and rules and regulations applicable to the Park System.

Makes arrests and issues citations for violations of laws and rules and regulations.

Performs checks on park vendors.

Investigates and prepares reports on motor vehicle, boat and personal injury accidents.

Provides emergency medical care for victims of accidents or illness until medical assistance arrives.

May serve as team leader over less experience Territorial Park Patrol Officers.

Performs related duties as required.

MINIMUM KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS:

Knowledge of laws, rules and regulations pertaining to the Territorial Park Protection System.

Knowledge of investigation and enforcement methods, procedures and practices.

Ability to interpret, apply and enforce pertinent laws, rules and regulations with tact, firmness and impartiality.

Ability to lead the work of others.

Ability to collect and assemble data and prepare reports.

Ability to maintain physical strength and agility.

Ability to work effectively with employees and the public.

Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing.

Ability to read and draw maps.

Ability to swim.

Ability to maintain records and prepare reports.

Skill in the safe operation of motor vehicles and boats.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- A.) Graduation from high school and two (2) years of experience as a Territorial Park Patrol Officer I or related field; or
- B.) Any or equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the minimum knowledge, abilities and skills.

NECESSARY SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Possession of a valid driver's license.
2. Current certification of Red Cross training in life saving and first aid.
3. Completion of Park Patrol Officer or related Peace Officer Training Program.
4. Submit a police clearance.
