**Who Can Apply**

Open to all government of Guam employees and the public.

**Necessary Special Qualifications**

Possession of a valid driver's license.

**Qualification Requirements**

One (1) year college education from a recognized or accredited college or university with course concentration in the Biological, Health Science, or related field, and graduation from high school; or

Any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the minimum knowledge, abilities and skills.

**Nature of work**

Performs field work in the investigation and control of communicable disease.

**Illustrative Examples of Work**

Performs field investigations to locate persons who may have communicable diseases and refers cases to health officials. Conducts communicable disease surveillance activities. Prepares the initial opening of charts on cases, suspects and contacts of communicable diseases. Interviews patients diagnosed as having communicable disease such as Venereal Disease and Tuberculosis to determine susceptible persons in the population. Maintains records and prepares activity reports. Assists with the education and information program relating to communicable disease. Performs related duties as required.

**Knowledge, Abilities & Skills**

Knowledge of basic principles and practices of health and hygiene. Knowledge of the basic principles of biology. Ability to learn the causes and means of transmission of communicable diseases. Ability to learn, interpret and apply program objectives, policies, procedures, and other guidelines. Ability to conduct interviews. Ability to make work decisions in accordance with program guidelines. Ability to work effectively with the public and employees. Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing. Ability to maintain records and prepare reports. Skill in the safe operation of a motor vehicle.

**Educational and Documentation Requirements**

Applicants claiming educational accomplishments are required to submit official or verified copies of transcripts or diplomas. The diploma, degree, or credits required must come from an educational institution that is accredited or recognized by either its government or a government recognized accrediting agency.

Employment in the service of the government of Guam shall have as a reasonable measure of job performance, the minimum educational requirement is a high school diploma or a successful completion of a General Educational Development (GED) Test, or any equivalent of a general education high school program, or a successful completion of a certificate program from a recognized accredited or certified vocational technical institution, pursuant to Public Law 29-113. **Suitability Determination Form**

Your employment application will not be deemed completed unless the Suitability Determination Form is completely filled out, signed and dated. If it is not complete or missing from your application, your application for this position will be rejected. Please pay particular attention to question #2. If you answer "yes", you must attach your police clearance that is no older than one (1) month from the date of submitting your application. In addition, please resubmit an updated Suitability form if anything occurred that warrants updating your responses on your Suitability Form after you have submitted your application.

**Prohibition Pursuant to P.L. 28-98**

No person convicted of a sex offense under the provision of chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry shall work in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam.

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## COMMUNICABLE DISEASE INVESTIGATOR

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### Examination Requirements

A written test is not required. Applicants will be rated on a scale between 70.00 and 100.00 percent on the basis of their training, education and experience in relation to the requirements of the position.

### Interviewing Procedures

A personal interview or interview by telephone (if off-island) will be held by the appointing authority or his or her designee for all eligible referred via certification.

### Employment Medical Examination

All applicants accepting employment must undergo a medical examination and be declared by the physician as capable of performing the duties of the position being hired for.

### Work Eligibility

When offered a position, you will be required to provide proof of identity and eligibility for employment in the United States as condition of employment.

### Drug Screening

Applicants selected for and offered employment with the Government of Guam shall undergo and pass a mandatory drug test before being employed. This also applies to employees selected for Test Designated Positions (TDP). Failure to submit or pass such drug test shall be grounds for rescinding the offer of appointment.

### Police & Court Clearances Requirements

If selected for this position, your selection will be conditional pending submission of a recent police and court clearance, and taking and passing a drug test (see Drug Screening section of the announcement). The hiring department will mail a letter to you explaining these requirements. You will have five (5) business days from the postmarked date of your letter to submit police and court clearances that are no older than one (1) month from the date of your letter. The cost of the clearances is your responsibility. If you have already submitted clearances with your employment application, you will not be required to resubmit as long as they meet the date criteria above. If you do not have any conviction or conditions that would warrant rescinding the job offer, and pass the drug test you will be notified of your start date.

### Where to Apply

Submit job applications at the Department of Administration, Human Resources Division 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, ITC building, Tamuning, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Individuals with disabilities who require special accommodation should contact this office prior to any scheduled examinations or interviews.
