

MULTI-MEDIA TECHNICIAN I

NATURE OF WORK IN THIS CLASS:

Performs semi-skilled work in the maintenance, repair and testing of audio-visual equipment.

Employees work under general supervision performing semi-skilled work or assist others in skilled work under close supervision.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Any one position may not include all the duties listed, nor do the examples cover all duties which may be performed.)

Performs maintenance, repair and testing of 16mm movie projectors, 8mm movie projectors, 35 mm slide and film strip projectors, monaural and stereo record players and tape recorders, overhead and opaque projectors, AM/FM radio receivers, public address systems and language labs.

Assists skilled workers in performing the full range of multi-media technician repair work.

Keeps records of work performed.

Performs related work as required.

MINIMUM KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES, AND SKILLS:

Knowledge of the maintenance, repair and testing of audio-visual equipment.

Ability to use a volt ohm meter and other test instruments.

Ability to interpret and work directly from service manuals, sketches and/or schematics.

Ability to operate audio-visual equipment.

Ability to understand and follow instructions.

Ability to maintain records of work performed.

Semi-skill in the repair of audio-visual equipment.

MINIMUM EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

(A) Two years of experience in the maintenance, repair and testing of audio-visual equipment.

(B) Any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the minimum knowledges, abilities and skills.
