**Who Can Apply**

Open to all government of Guam employees and the public.

**Qualification Requirements**

One (1) year of professional experience in general forestry and graduation from a recognized college or university with a Bachelor's degree in forestry or closely related field; or

Any equivalent combination of experience and training beyond the Bachelor's degree which provides the minimum knowledge, abilities and skills.

**Nature of work**

This is complex professional work in the management, development, and protection of forest lands and its resources. Employees in this class perform the full range of complex professional duties, including independent work in specialized areas of the profession. Employees often serve as team or group leaders over less experienced professional staff.

**Illustrative Examples of Work**

Participates and leads the work of crews in the management, development, and protection of forest lands and its resources. Assists immediate supervisor in coordinating and directing local projects within the scope of areas of responsibility. Detects, controls, and suppresses fires. Visits private and public landowners to advise on forestation and matters of fire hazards. Assembles progress reports on assigned projects. Conducts inspections for insect and/or disease damage, soil erosion, fire hazards, and causes, as well as mechanical damage to plantations. Prepares suitable reports for environmental impact studies that involve forestry activities. Conducts public education on both forestry and fire prevention programs. Performs related duties as required.

**Knowledge, Abilities & Skills**

Knowledge of the management of tropical forest land under multiple use, including silviculture, forestation, protection, forest, engineering, watershed management, wildlife, recreation and grazing. Knowledge of area and divisional organization and the function of the various positions. Knowledge of fire prevention, suppression and control. Ability to lead the work of others. Ability to train forestry personnel in the area. Ability to collect and analyze field research data. Ability to perform work of manual nature. Ability to work effectively with the public and employees. Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing. Ability to maintain records and prepare reports. Skill in the use of tools and equipment in forestation program.

**Minimum Educational Requirements**

All new employment in the service of the government of Guam shall have, as a reasonable measure of job performance, minimum requirement of a high school diploma or a successful completion of General Education Development (GED) test or any equivalent of a general education high school program, apprenticeship program or successful completion of a certification program, from a recognized, accredited or certified vocational technical institution, in a specialized field required for the job, pursuant to Public Law 29-113.

**Documentation Requirements**

To validate credentials you may claim, (e.g., High School Diploma, College Transcript, DD-214, etc.), an original or certified copy of the document(s) must accompany each employment application you are applying for with your legal signature. Applicants shall be responsible to provide all required documents for each employment application submitted and failure to provide proof may result in disqualification. **Suitability Determination Form**

Your employment application will not be deemed completed unless the Suitability Determination Form is completely filled out, signed and dated. If it is not complete or missing from your application, your application for this position will be rejected. Please pay particular attention to question #2. If you answer "yes", you must attach your police clearance that is no older than one (1) month from the date of submitting your application. In addition, please resubmit an updated Suitability form if anything occurred that warrants updating your responses on your Suitability Form after you have submitted your application.

**Prohibition Pursuant to P.L. 28-98**

No person convicted of a sex offense under the provision of chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry shall work in any agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam.

**Examination Requirements**

Applicants will be rated on a scale between 70.00 and 100.00 percent on the basis of their training, education and experience in relation to the requirements of the position.

**Interviewing Procedures**

A personal interview or interview by telephone (if off-island) will be held by the appointing authority or his designee for all eligibles referred via certification.

**Employment Medical Examination**

All applicants accepting employment must undergo a medical examination and be declared by the physician as capable of performing the duties of the position being hired for.

**Work Eligibility**

When offered a position, you will be required to provide proof of identity and eligibility for employment in the United States as condition of employment.

**Drug Screening**

Applicants selected for and offered employment with the Government of Guam shall undergo and pass a mandatory drug test before being employed; this also applies to employees selected for Test Designated Positions (TDP). Failure to submit or pass such drug test shall be grounds for rescinding the offer of appointment. In addition, persons who have applied for, or are seeking reemployment/reappointment in the government and previously had a non-negative drug test result must meet certain conditions to be re-drug tested for employment. **Police & Court Clearances Requirements**

If selected for this position, your selection will be **conditional** pending submission of a recent police and court clearance, and taking and passing a drug test (see Drug Screening section of the announcement). The hiring department will mail a letter to you explaining these requirements. You will have five (5) business days from the postmarked date of your letter to submit police and court clearances that are no older than one (1) month from the date of your letter. The cost of the clearances is your responsibility. If you have already submitted clearances with your employment application, you will not be required to resubmit as long as they meet the date criteria above. If you do not have any conviction or conditions that would warrant rescinding the job offer, and pass the drug test you will be notified of your start date.
